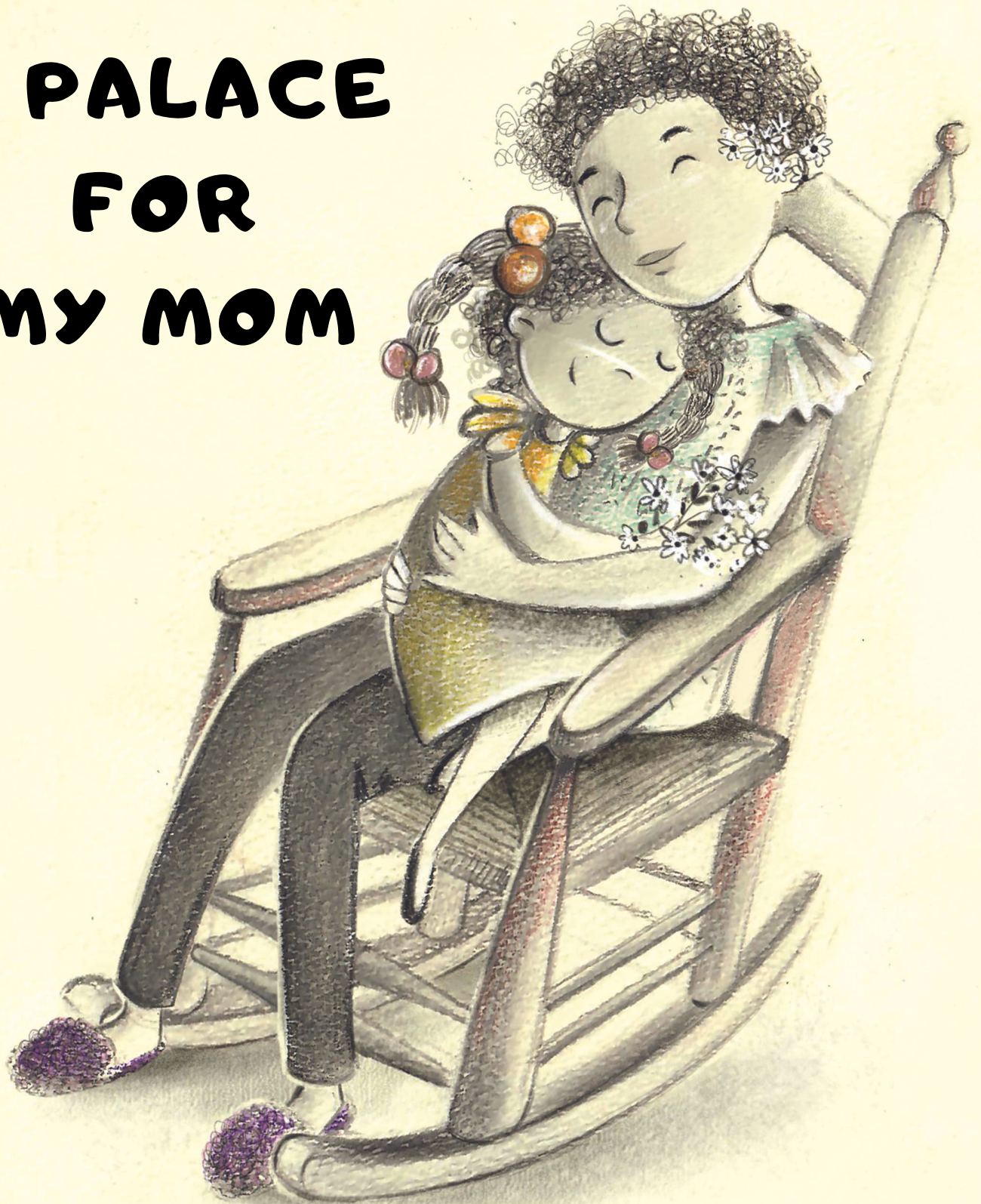

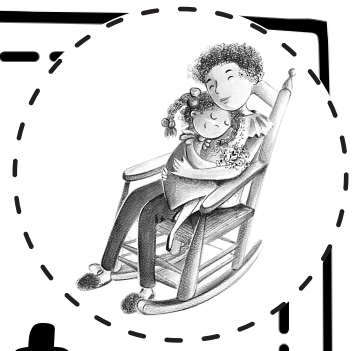

Engineering

Build a shadow box



Materials:

- A shoebox or small cardboard box
- Light craft paper
- Scissors, tape, glue sticks
- Small toys to create a story
- A flashlight

Prepare the Box:

Ask an adult to help you cut off the lid of the shoebox or cardboard

Directions:

- Decorate the outside of the box.
- Cut off the lid of the box from both the top and the bottom.
- Cover the bottom opening with craft paper.
- Place the box sideways with the screen (craft paper) facing out to the audience.
- Arrange small toys inside the box to create a little scenery inside your shadow box.

Test it out:

- Turn off the lights in the room.
- Shine the flashlight through the open side.

Show time:

Watch as the objects inside your box cast shadows on the background.

Playdough Characters



Try out this playdough recipe!

Bring the story to life by molding the characters and setting out of playdough!

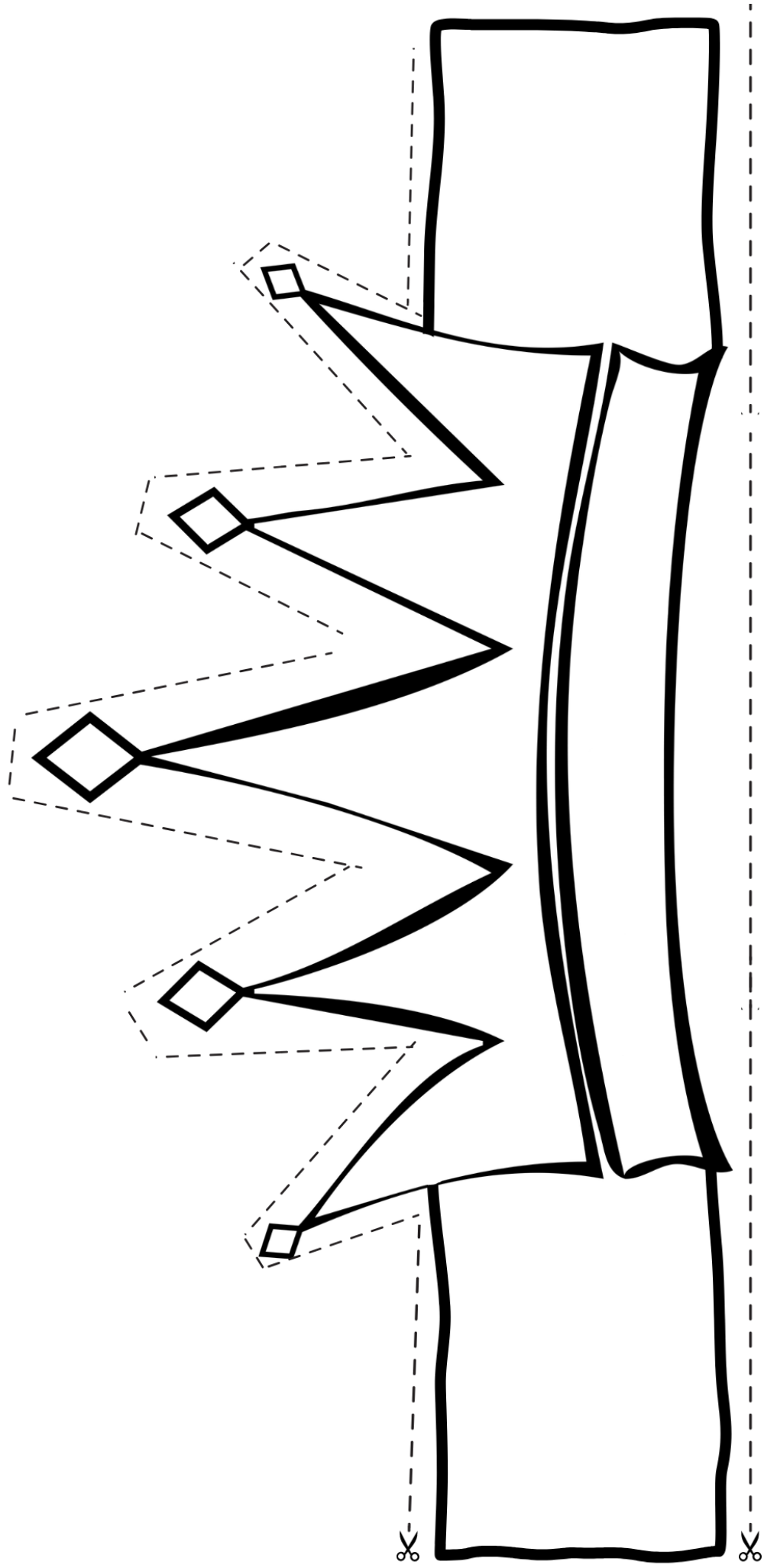
Ingredients:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tsp cream of tartar
- 1 cup water
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- Food coloring (optional)
- Essential oils or extracts for scent (optional)

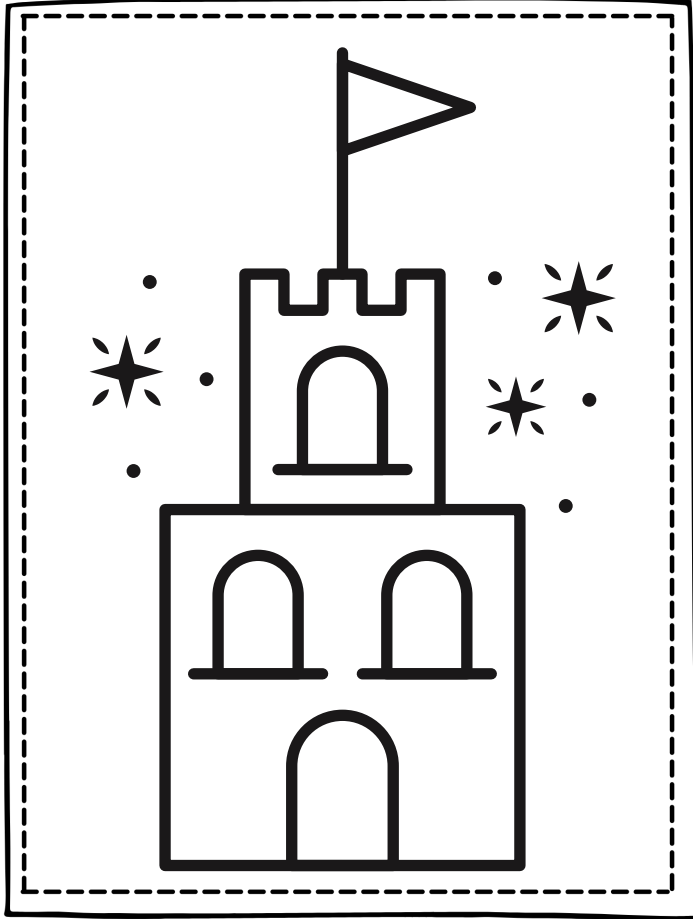
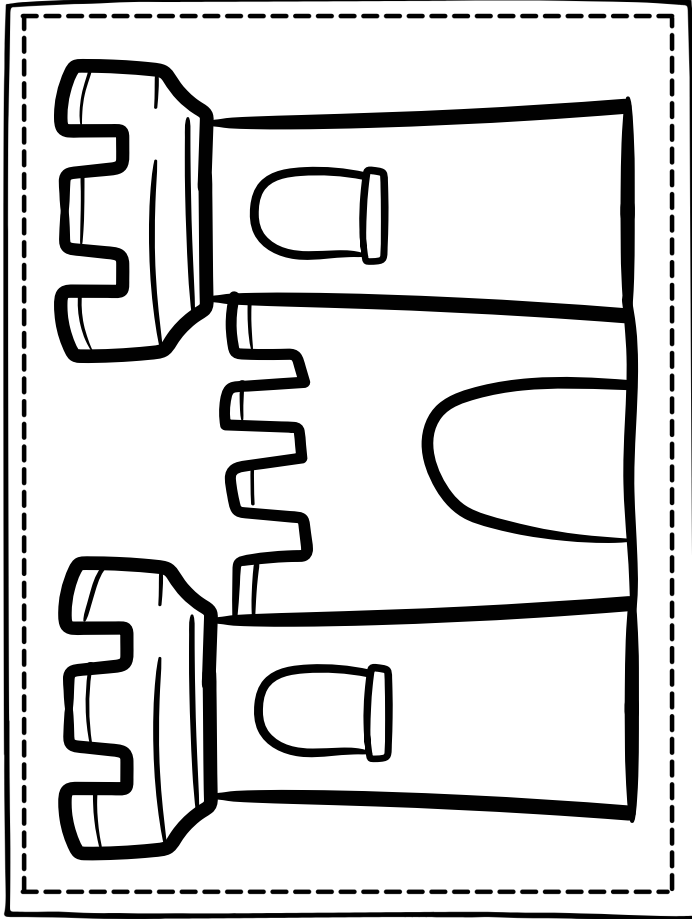
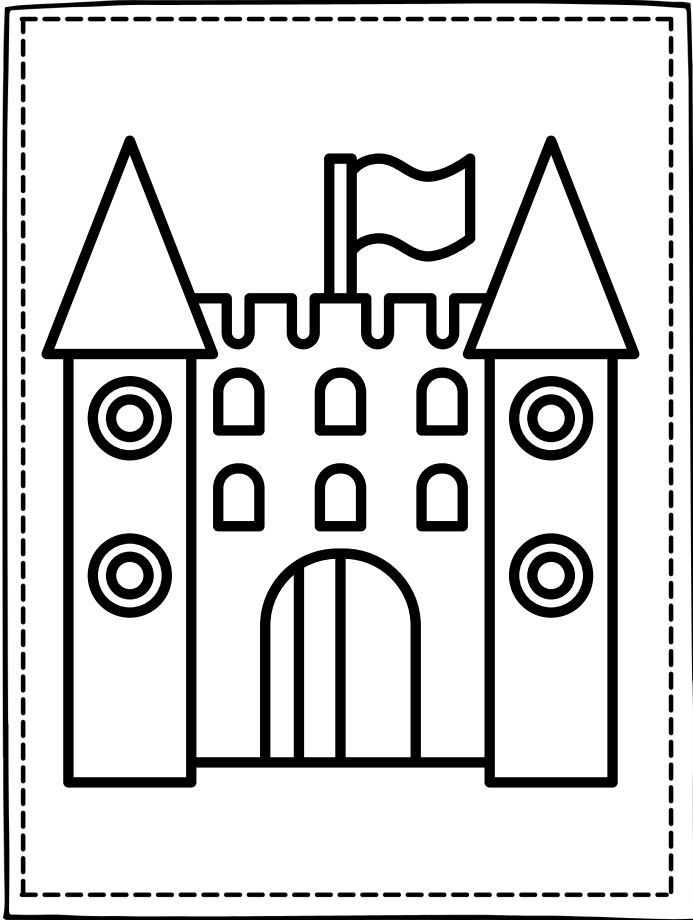
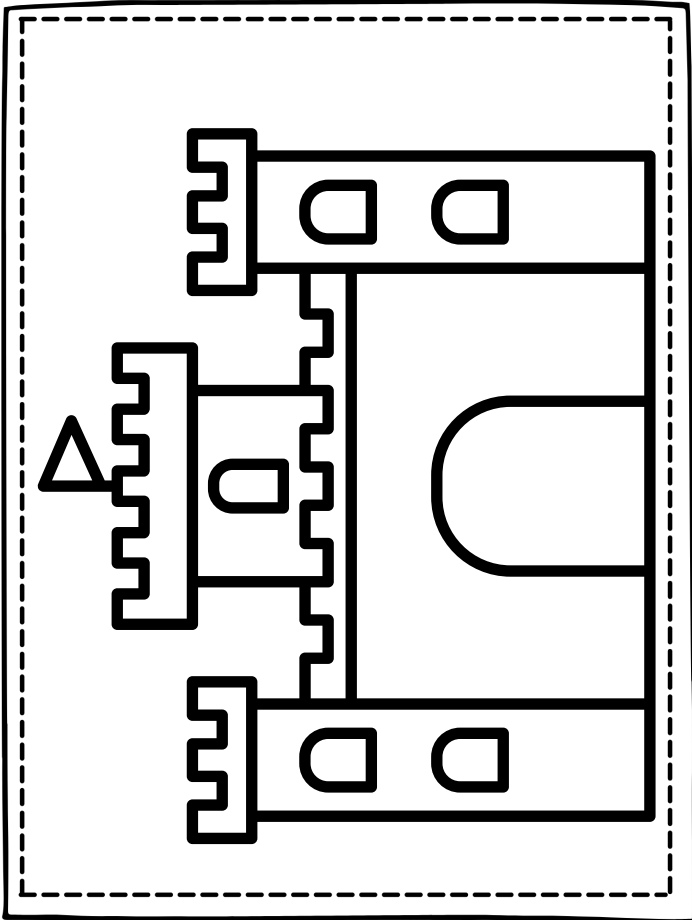
Instructions:

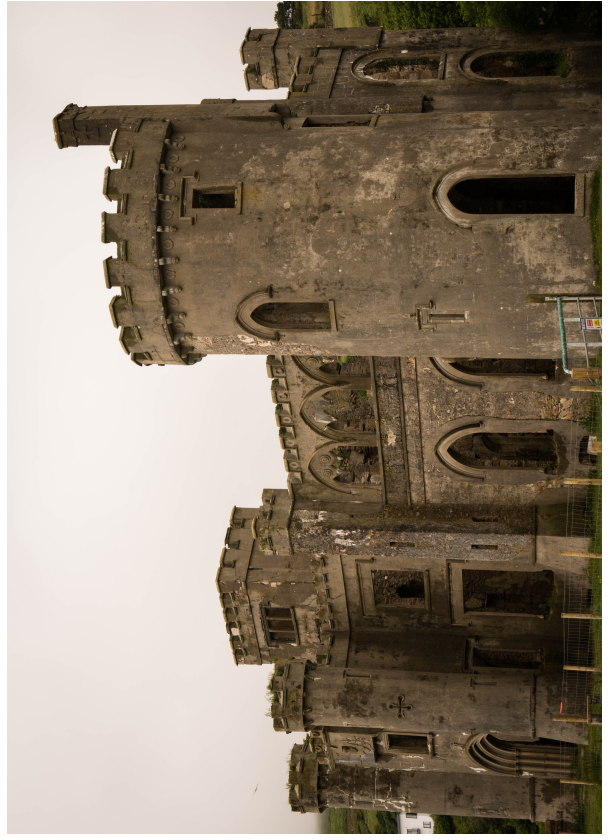
1. Mix flour, salt, and cream of tartar in a saucepan.
2. Combine water, vegetable oil, food coloring, and scent in a separate bowl.
3. Pour the wet mixture into the saucepan and stir.
4. Heat over low-medium heat, stirring until it forms a dough (3-5 mins).
5. Remove from heat, let cool a bit, and knead until smooth.
6. Playdough is ready to use!

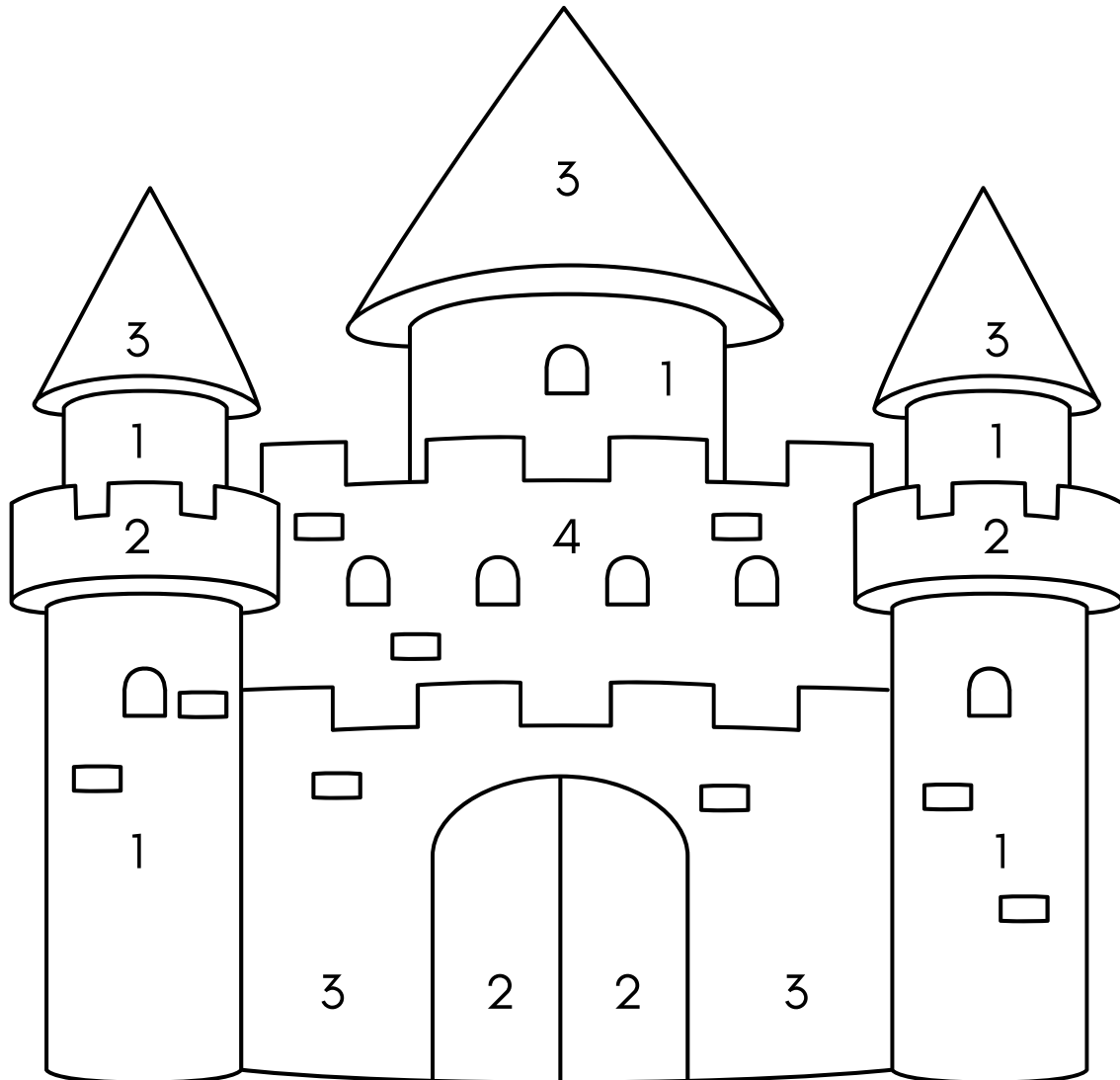
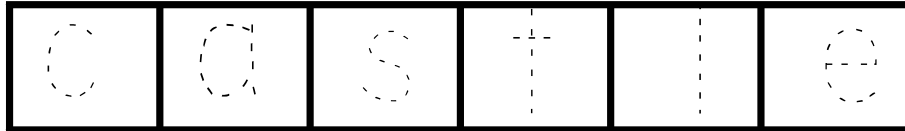
